The framework (Scenario) Guidelines aim to facilitate a scenario development process (within the Ten Year Network Development Plan) that ensures transparency, is non-discriminatory and delivers robust scenarios

Scenarios should be in line with:

- the energy efficiency first principle and
- the Union's 2030 targets for energy and climate and
- 2050 climate neutrality objective

Scenarios shall also take into account:

- the latest available Commission scenarios, as well as, when relevant,
- the national energy and climate plans.



Scenario development should fit comfortably in the 2-year Ten Year Network Development Plan cycle

Ensuring an **inclusive stakeholder engagement** process raises many questions

- How should the stakeholder engagement process look like in comparison to the current process?
- What is the appropriate length of a scenario development process that allows an inclusive stakeholder engagement process (bearing in mind the scenario development should comfortably fit within the 2-yearly TYNDP cycle)?
- What are the critical input moments for stakeholders to provide input?
- How to ensure the relevant stakeholders are ready to contribute with sufficient expertise?
- How to ensure stakeholder inputs do not lead to a biased scenario development?

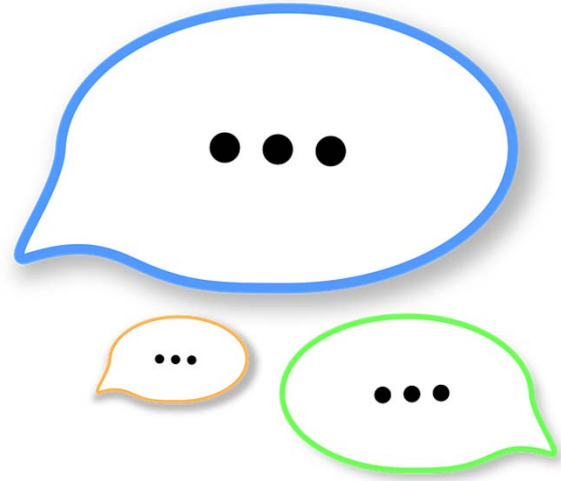
