1. MEETING OPENING PART

The sixth meeting of the Expert Group on the Power Purchase Agreements ('the Group') in a virtual format was opened and the agenda was approved.

The Chair provided a brief overview of the meeting's purpose.

2. DISCUSSION ON THE LIST OF DRAFT QUESTIONS FOR PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The Group provided general comments on the list of draft questions for public consultation, aimed at keeping the questions clear, comparable across respondents, and consistent with market practice. Feedback focused on (i) improving definitions and context where needed, (ii) avoiding wording that could lead to divergent interpretation, and (iii) ensuring that the questions capture relevant developments without constraining responses.

- **State-backed and private guarantee (as credit support)**

The Group advised using simple, neutral terminology and ensuring the scope is understood consistently.

- **PPA platform(s)**

The Group noted that different models exist and suggested framing questions in a way that accommodates variety.

- **Support schemes and interactions with PPAs**

The Group encouraged accurate wording and leaving room for respondents to describe national approaches and practical effects.

- **Additional questions**

The Group supported including a small number of complementary questions, while keeping framing accessible to a broad range of stakeholders.

3. FEEDBACK SESSION AND IDEAS FOR THE 2026 ASSESSMENT ON THE EU PPA MARKET

Participants exchanged brief reflections on the past two years of work, noting that the discussions were constructive and helped improve understanding of PPA market practices. ACER thanked members for their continued engagement and contributions.

ACER outlined initial ideas for the 2026 annual assessment. In addition to the public consultation, ACER is exploring the idea to further develop market monitoring and transparency, potentially with more automated approaches to presenting country-level information

ACER also mentioned the possible consideration of one or more case studies (possibly on hybrid PPAs) and the (re)establishment of a new expert group on PPAs for 2026-2028.

4. NEXT STEPS

ACER will consolidate the revised question set and share it with experts for written review. ACER indicated that the public consultation may be launched at the end of March 2026 and

that responses will be an important input for the 2026 annual assessment of the EU PPA market, planned for publication in November 2026.
